At a Court then held it was presented by the Honourable Court on the 27th day of May
then past Richard Golty, Son^r to the a Copyhold Tenant of the said Manor surrendered
Two pieces or parcels of Meadow or Pasture then in his possession
of Richard Wightman lying and being in Framlingham between
the Kings high-way leading from Torew Park towards —
Framlingham Street towards the East and other Lands of the said
Richard Golty on the part of the West abutting in part upon
Lands of Robt Hawes, Gout^r & Philip Capon towards the South
and Lands in the occupation of Robert Hill towards the North
with the Appurtenances -

To the Use of Moses Berry his Heirs & Assigns for ever who was then upon
admitted Tenant to the Premises so surrendered to him as aforesaid by the
following description - viz -

One Piece of Land formerly called Cane's Hill containing by
estimation nine Acres more or less with the Appurtenances
To hold to him the s^r Moses Berry and his Heirs
And he surrend^r to his will .

2 Octr 1703

At a Court then held it is recited that at the last General Court Baron held before the date of this Court it was presented by the Homage that Moses Berry a Copynhold Tenant had forfeited his Lands holden of the said manor to the Lords of the s^d Manor for that neither the said Moses nor any other Person for him had presented a certain Surrender by him taken of one Joseph Read To the two of dñe Rell of a certain Cottage of the said Joseph in Framlingham holden of the said Manor at the next Court holden for the said Manor after the taking thereof accordyng to the ancient custom of the said Manor by reason whereof the said Surrender was become void and the Lords were therefore injured Now at this Court the Lords of the said Manor out of their special grace & favour upon the humble petition of the said Moses Berry, and in consideration of a certain sum of money to them paid and in recontinuance of the ancient rents and services, did remant to the said Moses Berry the Lands so forfeited viz -

One Piece of Land formerly called Caneshill containing by estimation nine Acres more or less lying in Framlingham (then divided into divers parts) between the Kings Highway leading to Toreus Park towards the Street of Framlingham aforesaid & in towards the last and Lands of Sam^r Newson towards the west abutting upon Lands of Robt Haues Gout in part & Philip Capon towards the south, and Lands of Robt Nebbing, Gout

in the occupation of Robert Hill towards the North.

To which premises the said Moses Berry was admitted on the Surety
of Richd Holt at the afores^d Court held the 14th of Oct 1697.

To hold to him the s^r Moses Berry and his Heirs of the Lordes ex
and his success^r to his roiall

5th April 1731

At a Court then held it was presented by the Homage that on the 14th of Oct 1730 --
Moses Berry, surrendered,

Two pieces or parcels of Land or Pasture lying and being together
in Framlingham between the way leading from Toreas Park towards
Framlingham Street on the part of the East, and Lands of Thos
Newsom on the part of the West, abutting upon Lands of Robt
Hawes Gent in part and Lands of Philip Capon in part towards
the South & Lands of Robt Kelbring Gent towards the North
with the Appurtenances thereto by Copy of Court Roll of the s^r Manor

To the Use of the said Moses Berry and his Heirs until the
Solemnization of a marriage intended to be had between him and
Sarah Woolton, widow, and after the Solemnization thereof,

To the Use of the s^r Moses for Life - - - - - 7m^r

To the Use of the s^r Sarah his intended wife for Life - 7m^r

To the Use of the Heirs of the Body of the said Sarah by the

said Moses to be begotten
In default of such Issue To the Use of the Heirs of his Sarah for
ever -

And at this Court it was certified by the s^r Moses Berry that his recited
Marriage had been duly and solemnized and thereupon the s^r Moses Berry
Sarah his wife were adm^d Tenants,

To the Premises afores^d as last described - and to which he was
adm^d at the afores^d Court held the 14th of Oct^r 1697.

To hold to them the s^r Moses Berry Sarah his wife during the Term
of their natural Lives, and the Life of the longer Liver of them

1st Oct^r 1731

At a Court then held it was presented by the Homage that on the 27th
of Sept^r 1731 Sarah, the wife of Moses Berry, surrendered all her Inheritances -
Lands Tenements & Hereditaments whatsoever Holden of the s^r Manor To the
use of such Person and Persons for such Estate and Estates and to enforce such uses
Intents and Purposes as the s^r Sarah in and by her last Will and Testament in
Writing executed in the presence of three or more Witnesses sh^d declare limit
or appoint the same or any part thereof -

2nd Oct^r 1740

At a Court then held Sarah Berry, widow, acknowledg'd to hold of the Lord

in free & common socage certain Lands & Tenements late Berry's before Powles
by the yearly Rent of 5^d

8 Augst 1747

At a Court then held it was presented by the Houghage that on the 18th of July 1747 Sarah Berry, widow, surren^d All and every her Messuages Lands —
Tenements and Hereditis holden of the s^r Manor To the use of John Edwards
the younger of Dennington in the County of Suffolk & conin his Heirs & Assigns
for ever Upon Condition to be void on payment of 105L in manner therein
ment.

7 Augst 1755

At a Court then held the death of the s^r Sarah Berry was presen^d
by the Houghage and whereupon Stephen Woolton her only Son and Heir was admeⁿ
tenant under her Sund^e Will,

To the Premises aforesaid as last described
To hold to him and his Heirs according to the form & effect of
the s^r Sund^e Will —

And lesur^d to his will

And ackn^d a free tenne by the Rent of 5^d

The Will of the s^r Sarah Berry is dated the 20th of Feby 1747 and the Clause is worded as
follows — viz^l —

"Also I give devise and bequeath all other my Messuages or Tenements

"Also I give devise and bequeath all other my Messuages or Tenements
"Lands Hereditaments and Possessions whatsoever both freehold & copyhold
"with their and every of their Appurtenances situate lying and being in
"Framlingham aforesaid or elsewhere unto my s^d Son Stephen Woolton his
"Heirs and Assigns To hold to him the s^d Stephen Woolton his Heirs and
"Assigns for ever —

7 Aug^r 1756

At a Court then held a Court Surrender dated the 27th of April 1756 was
presented & entered from the s^d Stephen Woolton Of all and singular his Messes
Lands Tenements and Hereditaments whatsoever holden by Copy of Court
Roll of the s^d Manor which were then in the tenure or occupation of Jonathan
Heer or his Assigns lying & being in Framlingham aff^r To the Use of John
Edwards of Dennington Gent his Heirs & Assigns Upon Condition to be void
on payment of 200£ & Int^r in manner therein mentioned

same Court.

Acknowledgment of Satisfaction is entered on the aforesd Court Surrender dated
the 18th of July 1747 passed by the afores^d Sarah Berry to the s^d John Edwards —
by the name of J^en Edwards the Younger

2^o Oct 1784

At a Court then held the death of the s^d Stephen Woolton was presented
by the Homage And thereupon Lydia Woolton his widow was admitted under

his Surrender and Toile,

To the Premises afores^d as last described, and to which the
said Stephen was adm^r at the afores^d Court held the 7th
of Augst 1755.

To hold to this^s Lydia Wolton her Heirs -
And she acknowledge^r a free tenement by the Rent of 5^l.
And at the same Court surv^r to her Toile -

The Toile of the s^r Stephen Wolton is dated the 24th of Feb^r 1783, and the clause is
entered as follows - viz^e -

"First I will and order that my just debts and funeral charges -
"shall be fully paid and satisfied and after payment thereof I
"give and devise all and singular my messuages Lands Tenements
"Hereditaments and Premises as well Freehold as Copyhold
"with Heir and every of their Appurtenances situate lying and
"being in Framlingham aforesaid unto and to the use of my
"Wife Lydia Wolton and her Heirs and Assigns forever" -

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
